- 1. William Hickey 1846 C5 V
 - Drowned at property Cardross
 - 4 years old
- 2. William O'Reilly 1903 C3 C
 - 10 year old killed on the Crookwell train-line at North Goulburn, while collecting fallen coal.
- 3. Anna Maria de Lauret 1901 C7 V
 - A devoted Catholic of wealthy means.
 - Worked tirelessly for the orphanage & children's charities.
- 4. Alexander Taylor 1883 C8 V
 - Killed by falling tree while cutting down, at Shaws Creek near Goulburn.
- 5. **Duncan McDonnell**1861 C10 U
 - Grazier originally from Scotland.
 - Lived to 101.
- 6. **Warn Family** 1872 C11 U
 - Crookwell family [parents & 2 children] all asphyxiated overnight from fumes, when charcoal burned for warmth.
- 7. Lancelot Beck 1881 C1 D
 - Railway guard run over while shunting goods train at Gunning.

- 8. Patrick Leonard 1878 C9 P
 - Horse & cart swept away in swollen Wollondilly River when returning home for daughter's wedding.
- 9. James McGovern 1885 C7 P
 - Second mayor of Goulburn
 - Had Soap Factory in Clinton St.
- 10. Patrick Durack 1898 C2 N
 - Took cattle from Goulburn to settle Cooper Creek Qld
 - 1883 drove cattle to Kimberley in Western Australia.
- 11. Charles McAlister 1861 C4 K
 - Wrote 'Old Pioneering Days in Sunny South' – life in Goulburn from late 1830s.
- 12. William Thompson 1888 C3 H
 - A railway fettler run over by train at Towrang.
- 13. William Boardman 1860 C2 G
 - Died in fall from horse at Mummell.
- 14. **John Brooks** 1891 C4 C
 - Drowned crossing flooded
 Sooley Creek in horse and cart near Kingsdale.
- 15. Alexander McDonald 1878 C10 A
 - Emancipated convict
 - Worked as doctor but no formal qualifications.
