- 1. Sinclair Family 1848 P1 T
  - Christina Sinclair died 1848, wife of James Sinclair
  - Their home 'St Clair' in Sloane St is one of Goulburn's earliest homes.
- 2. **MacDonald Family** P7 T
  - Charles & Willie took cattle &two wagons from Laggan, across to west Kimberley of WA in 1880s to stock new land.
- 3. Alexander Fraser 1839 P5 W
  - Oldest remaining headstone in cemetery.
- 4. **William Thom** 1890 P14 Q
  - Taralga policeman thrown from horse & killed, while on duty.
- 5. William Ross 1869 P12 N
  - Early Presbyterian minister
  - Founding president of Mechanic's Institute 1869.
- 6. **Anne Ross** 1902 P12 N
  - Ran a school near the church
  - Later had a boarding school for young ladies.
- 7. Robert Waugh 1870 P10 N
  - Doctor & surgeon in Market St
  - Inventor & manufacturer of Waugh's baking powder.

- 8. Robert Craig Snr 1889 P5 N
  - Undertaker & founder of funeral business 1837.
- 9. Jane & Robert Craig Jnr P5 O
  - Continued the family funeral business still in Sloane St.
- 10. William Duncan 1882 P3 O
  - Stonemason
  - Builder of South Goulburn
    School and many public buildings
    from Young to Picton & Moruya.
- 11. **Walter Hess** 1902 P3 H
  - Railway engine driver accidentally killed at Clyde rail yards Sydney.
- 12. Thomas Wilkie 1907 P14 F
  - Builderof several grand homes.
  - Mayor of Goulburn 1903
- 13. Edward Bryden 1914 P9 D
  - Killed on 26 April at Gallipoli
- 14. John Knowlman 1910 P10 C
  - Founder of prominent Department Store
  - Magistrate & Mayor 1899.
- 15. James Somerville 1899 P5 [
  - Cycling accident in competition at Sydney Cricket Ground
- 16. Harry Chettle 1910 P2 B
  - Drowned while bathing in Shoalhaven River at Tallong.
