- **1. Leslie Dallas** 1918 W10 B
 - Killed in action in France. WWI
 - Private, aged 32.
- 2. **John Wright** 1932 W8 B
 - Coach-builder with early introduction of springs.
- 3. Herbert Dalton 1890 W7 B
 - Drowned aged 11, trying to save a friend.
- 4. Leslie Caine1916 W6 B
 - Killed in action in France. WWI
 - Private, aged 24
- 5. Samuel William Foxall 1914 W7 G
 - Stationary business in Islington House opp Belmore Park.
 - Founding member of Liedertafel.
- 6. William Riley 1861 W3 H
 - Editor of Goulburn Herald from 1858
 - Lived at 'Heraldene' Bradley St
- 7. Benjamin Hurst 1857 W7 H
 - Early minister of Wesleyan Church
 - His grave in centre with others facing towards him.
- 8. Robert Blatchford 1874 W8i
 - Grocer storekeeper
 - Buggy swept away at flooded Wollondilly Rossi Crossing.

- Joseph & Lydia lost 5 children under the age of 2 years.
- 10. Charles Rogers Snr & Jnr W4 L
 - Founder of Rogers emporium in & dominant business for 90 years
- 11. Whiting brothers W5 M
 - Falls from horses riding home to Taralga
 - Robert 1862 age 21
 - Richard 1864 age 15
- 12. Charles Walsh 1874 W1 N
 - Solicitor
 - First mayor of Goulburn in 1859
- 13. **Bob Grant** 1917 W9 L
 - Killed in action in France from injuries. WWI
- 14. **Stanley Beer** 1915 W12J
 - Army signaler in WWI
 - Killed in action at Dardanelles, Turkey, aged 21
- 15. Charles Fuller 1909 W10 G
 - Accountant
 - Secretary of Order of Oddfellows for 44 years.
- 16. **John Lumsden** 1928 W9 C
 - Headmaster at Goulburn South
 - Lumsden is a 'sporting house' at Goulburn High
